PRESIDENT HSU'S PRESENTATION

President Hsu's Power Point Presentation, "Fall 2022 Enrollment Snapshot," included a set-up structure of how he sees the College's enrollment situation in terms of the national and regional level market forces.

Vice President Amy Takayama-Perez will lead that discussion about the Fall 2022 class and lessons learned from the various strategies and new tools implemented this cycle.

John Loonan's Power Point Presentation provided an overview of the College's Fiscal Year 2023 preliminary budget and budgetary process that will be presented for the Board of Trustees' consideration/approval at the June Board Meeting/Retreat.
